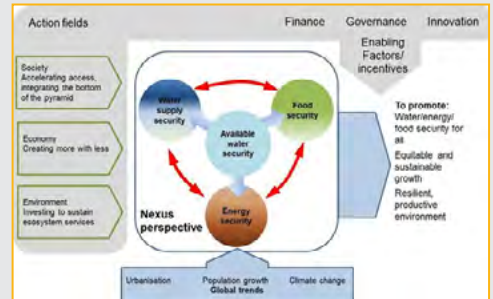


## LAUNCH OF THE 2022 UKZN FOOD SECURITY CULTURE
